Training and mentoring for CAF.  
Clear early information on how CAF is to be implemented in our area.

Training.  
Central/focussed - discussion on financial aspects. Co-ordination for multi-agencies and IT system.  
Access to relevant teaching matrons. Clear operational guidance for GPs so I can tell others. Copies of today's slides etc.  
Training packages. County events which can be more focussed on local priorities/concerns.  
Workshops in local authority areas (although these may already exist!!)  
Materials you will put on website from today and others.  
Work in multi-agency training.  
Awareness raising shared not just in projects that are already up and running.  
Expert trainers/case histories to promote positive use.  
Clear training programme - based on identified needs.  
We love Justine Gibling and her team already.  
Sharing of learning.  
Engaging opportunities to share good practice in other areas.  
Improved leadership and commitment with the PCT.

Information - context of CAF - how it will be adapted in my area - training. CAF Champion/Lead Professional.  
Use CAF for consistent approach and commissioning approach.  
Happy to continue work with Bridges.  
Strategies.  
Awareness in schools, PCT, families.  
Access to information and guidance.  
Time for training. Clear responsibilities, roles identified.  
Development of patchwide children's centres to link with as an organisation who works alongside localities.  
Practicalities, that Justine Gibling mentioned and who will support/give the answers.  
Organisation of training/information sharing events.  
Easy to understand 'job description' of Lead Professional to pass onto people.  
Promotion of advantages of voluntary sector but need to fund them to do it.  
A mentor - leadership at all levels - support  
Training key players and making them 'softer' towards the fact that it can perform.

Hands on training, attend meetings to see how agencies work - shadowing.  
Raising awareness - challenging culture - move towards integrated working and common assessment.  
More CAF Leads/Champions. Managers 'owning' it and disseminating information etc.  
Ways in which we engage the service users in order for them to take ownership and help make a difference themselves.  
Information regarding progress of CAF implementation.  
Full training on the mechanics of carrying out a CAF assessment.  
Links with CAF implementation officer, multi-agency training. Different levels. Based on clusters of schools including staff from partnership agencies.  
Everyone talking to each other.  
Pump priming money for the DfES.  
Information on how to engage difficult to engage partners i.e. independent and private sector. time resource and support from Head of Directorate.  
Resources, training support for Lead Professional.  
Systems for sharing information.  
Ensure that everyone is trained and positive about developing the key messages and using effectively.  
Local event required to promote CAF.  
Support in getting schools on board - some hesitancy/resistance from parts of the sector due to their perception of additional work generated by CAF process.  
We have quite a bit at present.  
Already have great support mechanism in Derby.  
Supervision.  
Training off the job - need good facilitators.  
Parents training package. Sight of existing work such as existing protocols etc and booklet of terms and conditions.  
To be kept informed of ongoing developments.  
Publish a national register of CAF Leaders who can share good practice.  
Good practice examples and contacts for more details.  
Multi-agency training on CAF led by leads from each of the appropriate areas.
