What is a Pulse Session?

Within this Regional Learning Project (RLP) we are always trying new ways of sharing learning in a pacy manner. In the three main interactive sessions at 10.30, 11.45 and 2.30 the focus pulses between the main platform and breakout groups as follows:

5 minutes introduction to outline the focus and the question to be explored for the session – all delegates together.

25 minutes to hear the narratives from around the region that highlight practice relating to this theme/question. Delegates will select from up to 10 case studies positioned around the hall.

10 minutes Q&A within these 'break out' groups to explore the issues that are emerging from the practice described.

All delegates back together for **5 minutes** while floating observers feed back on some of the key themes they have picked up as they have been wandering around the break out groups.

15 minutes general forum Q&A to tease out the key learning points that provide some potential answers and possible ways forward.
