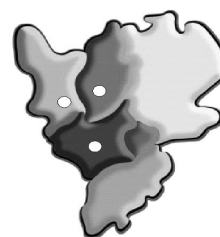

It will be a very practical conversation about the realities and some of the pros and cons being learnt along the way.</p>	<p><b>2. She also supports St Ann's and Sneinton 'Life' events which were devised by a local school and another EIP team member, James. These events are multi agency and again support local families by bringing everyone together on school sites. Through 'Moodle' and online forums we find out what students really think in a way they like and this helps shape our provision. We are starting to use these same methods for other users, including parents and the community, and this will hopefully offer you ideas for a template you might want to adopt.</p>	<p><b>3. Also, how the school links in with other multiagency teams such as the police 'Vulnerable Persons Panel'.

Delegates attending this session will learn how a school with levels social deprivation that are in the bottom 20% of schools can have SAT results in the top 20% of all schools. There isn't a simple single answer, but I'm happy to share my vision for schools. I'll tell you about taking risks, identifying your strengths, instilling passion, looking for allies, not allowing the curriculum or the school day to stand in your way. It's also about tackling the issue of boys in school, being creative and making sure your children and staff are fit, healthy and well. I can also talk about pace and I'm not afraid to tell you that the Nursery is the most important area in school. I'll give you ten things you can do tomorrow that will make an impact on your school, teachers and most importantly the children

<b>9. Teenage Pregnancy</b>

St Andrew's has been on a journey from being a good school to a great one! The biggest reason for this improvement is down to developing our work with colleagues and partners from across all sectors. We believe that schools can only become fantastic by enabling all services to meet the needs of the young people and their families. Delegates who attend this session will hear about how St Andrew's school works well with everyone and how this stems from a leadership approach which highlights the positives and embraces the skills of others.

<b>11. The Brunts School</b>

Delegates attending this session will receive a snapshot of The Brunts School and our work with agencies and services to support and personalise the learning of the most vulnerable students to enable them to achieve and aspire. Details of systems and provisions within school, links with special schools and external providers and examples of student success will be included. Delegates will also see a video presentation of two students explaining how the college courses have helped them engage with school and achieve a qualification.
