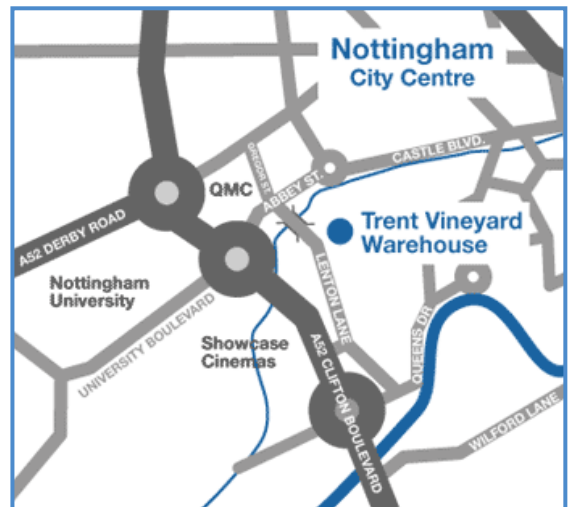
### Purpose of the day
